

A. Introduction

All physician staffed first aid stations at Hard Rock Stadium have the capability of providing first aid, BLS and limited ALS care to employees and guests. Physician staffed first aid stations may be considered for certain patients who meet the criteria outlined in this procedure. It is incumbent upon all Fire Rescue personnel involved, to act in the patient's best interest. Proper screening and accurate patient assessment must be utilized to determine the appropriate level of care needed.

This procedure is for various types of patients encountered in the event setting and will apply to <u>ALL</u> patients treated by Miami-Dade Fire Rescue at Hard Rock Stadium during Super Bowl LIV. This procedure is a supplemental document to Protocol 4 and all other applicable Medical Operations Manual requirements.

B. Procedure

- 1. After a complete evaluation, the unit OIC <u>may</u> transfer an adult patient meeting the below criteria to a physician staffed first aid station:
 - a. Alcohol intoxication when GCS = 15 and ETCO2 is \geq 30mmHg
 - b. Superficial 1st degree thermal burns
 - c. Stable asthmatic patient without wheezing
 - d. Extremity injuries (sprains, strains, abrasions)
 - e. Simple lacerations excluding face and neck
 - f. Nausea and vomiting without abdominal pain
 - g. Heat related problems with a GCS of 15 and no neurological symptoms
 - h. Allergic reactions not medicated by MDFR
- 2. <u>An EMS Field Supervisor or the Medical Director MUST verify the patient's condition prior to</u> the patient being released to the physician staffed first aid station.
- 3. All transport decisions and/or transport destinations as directed by the EMS Field Supervisor assigned to the event are final.
- 4. The decision to transfer patient to a physician staffed first aid station will be documented in the Narrative section of the electronic Patient Care Report. The unit OIC will select the ePCR disposition of <u>"Treated, Transferred to Super Bowl Clinic"</u> for all patients released to the physician staffed first aid stations.
- 5. At no time will an unstable ALS patient be released to a physician staffed first aid station. Unstable ALS patients will be transported in accordance with Protocol 4.
- 6. If there is any doubt or concern about a patient's condition the patient will be transported by an MDFR Rescue unit to a hospital, as defined on the "Hospital Capability Chart".
