# TRIAGE

	Don appropriate vest.
	Radio designation TRIAGE.
	Distribute the triage ribbons.
	Direct personnel to triage victims where they lay and correct any life-threatening problems (i.e. airway obstruction or severe hemorrhage).
	Assign personnel to triage the "walking wounded."
	Ensure that all areas of the incident have been checked for victims and that all victims have been triaged.
—	Report to COMMAND the number and triage category of victims.
	Coordinate with TREATMENT or TRANSPORT of the movement of all victims.
	Once triage is completed, contact COMMAND for further assignment of personnel.

# **TREATMENT**

Don appropriate vest.
Radio designation TREATMENT.
Establish TREATMENT area considering the location, setting (HM, weather, etc.), ease of funneling victims, ingress/egress routes.
Have sufficient personnel available to move victims.
Request staffing through STAGING and request all units to bring their equipment to TREATMENT to provide for interventions.
Obtain a Documentation Aid.
Direct personnel to either begin treatment on victims where they lay OR establish a centralized treatment area.
Direct personnel to perform secondary triage with the METTAG.
Advise TRANSPORT of victim(s) requiring immediate transportation.
Advise COMMAND as to any changes in the victim count or category.
Coordinate with TRANSPORT the movement of victims to the transportation area.
