

## A. Introduction

To provide a resource for acquiring antivenin serum of venomous reptiles from around the world that will be available to any municipality within Miami Dade County and areas elsewhere.

## **B. Procedure**

General Care

- 1. When a call is received reporting a person that has sustained a suspected venomous reptile injection, Venom 1 will be contacted.
- 2. The OIC on scene will advise Venom 1 of the situation at which time it will be determined whether the Antivenin Bank will be activated.
- 3. If it is determined to be a non-native venomous snakebite, Venom 1 or a designee will respond to the Antivenin Bank and select the appropriate serum and quantity needed.
- 4. Venom 1 or designee will contact the Receiving Hospital's Emergency Department Physician to verify the need and quantity of serum prior to packaging and shipping.
- 5. If the incident occurs within Miami Dade County, the following resources can be used to transport the serum to the Receiving Facility:
  - a) Venom 1 or designee
  - b) Closest Fire Rescue unit
  - c) Closest EMS Field Supervisor or Battalion Chief
  - d) Air Rescue (for critical cases only)
  - e) Miami-Dade Police helicopter
- 6. If the incident occurs outside of Miami Dade County, the following resources can be used to transport the serum to the Receiving Facility:
  - a) Agency requesting serum
  - b) Venom 1 or designee
  - c) Florida Highway Patrol
  - d) Air Rescue (if critical and < 150 miles)
  - e) Other air transport
- 7. Long distance transfers will be handled through prior arrangements with commercial airlines.
- 8. Under no circumstances will antivenin serum be administered outside the hospital unless a physician administers it.
